FREE THINGS TO DO

St George Street

Walk the pedestrian mall and discover an array of artsy and souvenir shops, ice cream shops, restaurants, and museums. Don't forget to take a peek down the side streets for some hidden gems. It's also a great place to grab a bench and do some people watching.

St Augustine Beach & Fishing Pier

Walking on the beach and sunbathing is always free! You can also visit the St Johns County Ocean and Fishing Pier. For a nominal fee of \$2, you can walk to the end of the pier for some great views of the ocean and the coastline. The pier is located at 350 A1A Beach Blvd.

Fort Matanzas

A national park, Fort Matanzas used to guard St Augustine from the south. Admission to the park is free and you can take the free ferry over to tour the fort. The fort is located at 8635 A1A South.

Fort Mose Historic Park

Fort Mose is the first free African settlement in North America. The site and visitor's center tell the story of the slaves who fled the American colonies to find freedom in St Augustine. Park is free and a boardwalk takes you out to some great views of the salt marsh. The park is located at 15 Fort Mose Trail.

Governor's House Cultural Center and Museum

This building served as a capitol in the new territory of Florida in 1821. It has also served as a courthouse and post office. Inside the building, you'll find rotating exhibits on the history of St Augustine and Florida, with many fascinating artifacts and archaeological finds. Governor's House is located on the west end of the Plaza de la Constitucion at 48 King Street.

Free Church Tours

Three major churches in St Augustine are free to explore. Cathedral Basilica, the oldest congregation in the United States also offers behind-the-scenes tours with tickets available at the rental office. Flagler Memorial Presbyterian Church was built by Henry Flagler. He is interred there along with his wife and young daughter. Also, the Mission Nombre de Dios has beautiful grounds, a cemetery, and an ivy-covered chapel. Cathedral Basilica is located at 38 Cathedral Place. Memorial Presbyterian is located at 32 Sevilla Street. The Mission is located at 89 A1A, a section also known as San Marco Avenue.

Winery and Distillery

San Sebastian Winery offers free tours and tastings. They also have a restaurant on the rooftop. They are located at 157 King Street. St Augustine Distillery also offers free tours and tastings and they also have a restaurant and a well-stocked gift shop so you can take home some award-winning spirits. The Distillery is located at 112 Riberia Street.

Fort Mose Militia Muster

On the first Saturday of every month, Fort Mose offers a trip back to the 18th century for militia muster and training. Watch the soldiers practice firing drills and demonstrate how to use historic weapons. Event is 9-11:30. Fort Mose is located at 15 Fort Mose Trail.

Pet Walk Pup Crawl

On the second Saturday of the month take your four-legged friend on a walking tour of St Augustine's downtown area. All pets must be on leash. Tour leaves from the Tour St Augustine office at 4 Granada Street. Reservations required by calling 904-825-0087.

Tolomato Cemetery and Huguenot Cemetery

The two historic cemeteries are only open one day per month for tours on the third Saturday. Huguenot is the oldest extant cemetery in the US with burials that date back to the early 1800s. The Tolomato has burials that date from the 16th to 18th century. The Huguenot is located on Avenida Menendez across from the Old City Gates. Tolomato is located at 14 Cordova Street.

Black Heritage & Civil Rights Walking Tour

Learn about St Augustine's rich civil rights history on the third Saturday of the month. More than 400 years of African-American history come alive during this walking tour. Learn about the events that led up to the signing of the Civil Rights Act in 1964. Tours depart from the Tour St Augustine office at 4 Granada Street. Reservations required 904-825-0087.

Historic Walking Tour

Tour St Augustine also offers a downtown walking tour, offering a personal view of the Old City's brick-lined streets and historic structures. Learn about more than 450 years of St Augustine's history. Tours offered on the fourth Saturday of the month. Reservations required 904-825-0087.

RAINY DAY ACTIVITIES

Even though St Augustine Beach is an outdoors kind of place, there is still plenty to do indoors!

St Augustine is full of museums and art galleries. Check out these three museums, located very close to each other just north of the Plaza de la Constitucion: The Spanish Military Hospital Museum, the Ximenez-Fatio House, and the Father O'Reilly House, all located on Aviles Street, with easy parking in the area.

Art galleries are dotted up and down Aviles Street, so you can stop in to those as you work your way down the brick road.

Stop in to the Lightner Museum for a real treat. The collections here are primarily from the Gilded Age, and located in the former Alcazar Hotel, built by Henry Flagler in 1888.

About a block from the Lightner is Villa Zorayda, a scaled replica of the Alhambra Palace in Spain.

Flagler College also offers tours and it's right across the street from the Lightner. The college is the former Ponce de Leon Hotel, also built by Henry Flagler. One of the highlights of the tour is the student dining room with the 79 Tiffany stained glass windows. The buildings are a classic example of Spanish Renaissance architecture, built in 1888.

Feeling energetic? Stop by the St Augustine Lighthouse and climb the 219 stairs to the top for a spectacular view of the beaches and the Ancient City.

There's Epic Theater on State Road 207, but you can also see movies at the IMAX Theater at World Golf Village. There you'll find the World Golf Hall of Fame and Museum, which is about 40 minutes from St Augustine Beach.

Check out Corazon Cinema and Café at 36 Granada Street, next to the Lightner Museum. They show movies and serve a great lunch! Check out their website for some free activities too!

St Augustine is home to two outlet malls at I-95 and State Road 16, about 25 minutes from St Augustine Beach.

Like antiques? Take your umbrella on a stroll through Uptown, on San Marco Avenue just north of downtown and the parking garage. You'll find some great antique stores, art galleries, and a few restaurants. Don't miss Luli's Cupcakes!

Off St George Street near the fort, you'll find the famous Potter's Wax Museum. Feed your knowledge of St Augustine and history by taking a trip through the House of Wax.
