FREE THINGS TO DO

St George Street

Walk the pedestrian mall and discover an array of artsy and souvenir shops, ice cream shops, restaurants, and museums. Don't forget to take a peek down the side streets for some hidden gems. It's also a great place to grab a bench and do some people watching.

St Johns County Pier Park

Walking on the beach and sunbathing is always free! You can also visit the St Johns County Ocean and Fishing Pier. For a nominal fee of \$2, you can walk to the end of the pier for some great views of the ocean and the coastline. Also check out the Splash Park for kids. Open daily until dusk. Great for small children to stay cool! The pier is located at 350 A1A Beach Blvd.

Fort Mose Historic Park

Fort Mose (pronounced mo-zay') is the first free African settlement in North America. The site and visitor's center tell the story of the slaves who fled the American colonies to find freedom in St Augustine. Park is free and a boardwalk takes you out to some great views of the salt marsh. The park is located at 15 Fort Mose Trail. Museum onsite has a nominal fee.

Governor's House Cultural Center and Museum

This building served as a capitol in the new territory of Florida in 1821. It has also served as a courthouse and post office. Inside the building, you'll find rotating exhibits on the history of St Augustine and Florida, with many fascinating artifacts and archaeological finds. Governor's House is located on the west end of the Plaza de la Constitución at 48 King Street.

ACCORD Civil Rights Museum

Housed in the former dentist office of Dr Robert Hayling, it was the headquarters of the Civil Rights Movement in St Augustine that led to the signing of the Civil Rights Act of 1964. Learn about the demonstrations that Dr. Martin Luther King Jr led in the city. Museum is free but you must make an appointment. Call 904-347-1382.

Church and Mission Tours

Mission Nombre de Dios has beautiful grounds, a cemetery, and an ivy-covered chapel. The Mission is located at 89 A1A, a section also known as San Marco Avenue. Memorial Presbyterian at 32 Sevilla St. offers tours on Fridays 11am-330pm. Suggested donation \$5. Also, the Cathedral Basilica is open (free) and they also have behind the scenes tours (for a fee).

Winery and Distillery

San Sebastian Winery offers free tours and tastings. They also have a restaurant on the rooftop. They are located at 157 King Street. St Augustine Distillery also offers free tours and tastings and they also have a restaurant and a well-stocked gift shop so you can take home some award-winning spirits. The Distillery is located at 112 Riberia Street. Also City Gates Spirits lets you try a variety of spirits inspired by the flavors of Florida. Open 7 days a week. Located on St George St.

Tolomato Cemetery and Huguenot Cemetery

The two historic cemeteries are only open one day per month for tours on the third Saturday. Huguenot is the oldest extant cemetery in the US with burials that date back to the early 1800s. The Tolomato has burials that date from the 16th to 18th century. The Huguenot is located on Avenida Menendez across from the Old City Gates. Tolomato is located at 14 Cordova Street.

Fort Matanzas

Take the free ferry to the watchtower built in 1740 to protect St Augustine from the south. Admission and ferry are free to this National Park. Open Wednesday through Sunday. Located at 8635 A1A South.

St Photios National Greek Orthodox Shrine

This shrine honors the arrival of the first Greek settlers to St Augustine in 1768. See the beautiful museum and chapel free of charge. There's also a gift shop with some unique items. Open every day and located on St George St.

Father Miguel O'Reilly House Museum

Learn about the rich Catholic traditions that date back to St Augustine's founding in 1565. Open Wednesday through Saturday. Located at 32 Aviles St.

A1A Scenic and Historic Coastal Byway

St Johns County features 42 miles of scenic highway, including many views of the Atlantic Ocean. Get in the car and take a ride up or down the coast from Ponte Vedra Beach to Flagler Beach.

Concerts at Colonial Oak Music Park

Free live local music under the Colonial Oak! Food and drink available on-site. Located on St George St.

Art Galleries

The great thing about art galleries is that they are free to look! Check out the galleries along King Street opposite the plaza and on Aviles St. Cutter & Cutter, Philip Anthony, and James Coleman galleries have some really unique works. Also visit the St Augustine Art Association. They've been promoting local arts since 1924. Open 1-4pm Tuesday through Sunday and also during First Friday Art Walk. Located at 22 Marine St.

RAINY DAY ACTIVITIES

Even though St Augustine Beach is an outdoors kind of place, there is still plenty to do indoors! Just make sure you grab your umbrella!

St Augustine is full of museums and art galleries. Check out these museums, located very close to each other just north of the Plaza de la Constitución: The Spanish Military Hospital Museum and the Ximenez-Fatio House, all located on Aviles Street, with easy parking in the area. Also might check out the Oldest House Museum Complex, farther down on Francis Street. Free parking! See a complete list of museums in this Visitor's Guide.

Art galleries are dotted up and down King and Aviles streets, so you can check those out as you work your way down the road.

Stop in to the Lightner Museum for a real treat. The collections here are primarily from the Gilded Age, and located in the former Alcazar Hotel, built by Henry Flagler in 1888.

About a block from the Lightner is Villa Zorayda, a scaled replica of the Alhambra Palace in Spain.

Feeling energetic? Stop by the St Augustine Lighthouse and climb the 219 stairs to the top for a spectacular view of the beaches and the Ancient City.

There's the Epic Theater on State Road 207. Lots of blockbuster films – great for a rainy day.

St Augustine is home to an outlet mall at I-95 and State Road 16, about 25 minutes from St Augustine Beach.

Like antiques? Take your umbrella on a stroll through Uptown, on San Marco Avenue just north of the downtown parking garage. You'll find some great antique stores, art galleries, and a few restaurants. Don't miss Luli's Cupcakes!

On Orange Street near the fort, you'll find the famous Potter's Wax Museum. Feed your knowledge of St Augustine and history by taking a trip through the House of Wax.
